The LED sign has been installed, any information from the Trustees, Fire Department will be posted on the sign.

Open burn policies

This is a reminder that the Montville Fire Department requires a Burn permit. These permits are valid for 30 days. Permits can be obtained at the Fire Station. Depending on the situation an on-site inspection may be needed before a permit will be issued. The permit will be valid for yard waste only. Shingles, roofing material, or any non

If burning, any source of extinguishment is required close by IE: Fire Extinguisher or garden hose.

organic material will not be allowed.

Ohio Revised Code 1503.18 Ohio DNR Forestry prohibits outdoor open burning and prescribed fires in the months of March, April, May, October, and November between 6am and 6pm.

This ban includes burning of yard waste, trash, and debris, even in a proper burn barrel.

Even outside the time and date restrictions, any person conducting a burn must obtain landowner permission, remain with the fire while it is burning, and take all reasonable precautions to prevent the fire from escaping.

Burn permits are available on the Montville Twp website, you can print



the form at home and bring it to the Fire station for processing. The website is www.montvillegeauga.com

Burn Permits are not valid for Commercial Property

Commercial property needs to get a burn permit from the Lake County Health Department.

Senior Trash Pick-Up Days are May 18-19

The Montville Township Trustees and Montville Road Department are joining forces with Geauga County Department on Aging for the 2021 Montville Township Senior Trash Pick-Up Day May 18 and 19, 2021. In order to be placed on the Trash Pick-up list, you must first register with the Geauga County Department on Aging, be 60 years

of age or older and live in Montville Township. Those signing up for pick-up, please have a list of items to be removed.

The Department on Aging can no longer go into seniors homes to pick-up unwanted items. The Montville Township Road Crew and the Department on Aging will pick-up refuse from Montville senior's garages, out buildings, and drives.

Please note the following guidelines:

- To prevent possible bed bug transferal (or other pest), all mattresses, couches and upholstered furniture MUST be wrapped in plastic and taped securely or they will not be taken.
- Clearly mark all boxes or bags "TRASH DAY" so crews only take items intended for Trash Pick-Up. If items are not marked, they will not be picked up.
 - · The following items will NOT be accept-

ed: Construction/Remodeling debris, liquids, paint or other hazardous materials, rocks, yard waste, or household garbage. Reduce wood or pipe to 6' or less. Consolidate all small materials in strong boxes or containers. We will accept unbroken car batteries, lawn mowers, and tires off the rim - 4 per load.

• Please, only 10 household items per home, and items should be from the registered senior's household only. Items should be left out the evening before trash pick-up. DO NOT leave items by the curbside.

CLEAN-UP DAY is scheduled for May 22, 2021 from 8 a.m. to noon. Residents must bring their IDs. We accept appliances (freon must be removed from refrigerators/freezers as well as the doors), furniture, scrap metals and items too large for weekly trash collection. We will accept up to 6 rimless tires. We do NOT accept concrete/rocks/yard ornaments, liquids, fluorescent bulbs, batteries, yard waste, televisions, computers or propane tanks.
